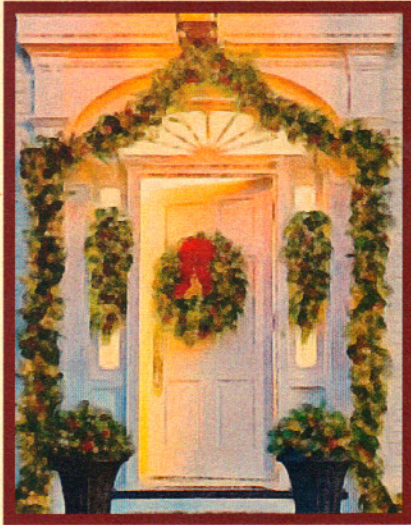

1. Classes are open only to current members of Seventh District Federated Garden Clubs of New York State, Inc.
2. Entries will be received on Tuesday, November 1, 2016 from 4:00 to 8:00 pm and on Wednesday, November 2, 2016 from 7:30 to 9:15 am. Advance registration is required for all entries in the Design and Special Exhibits Divisions. Advance registration is required for Sections D, E, F, and G in the Horticulture Division.
3. All exhibits must be removed by 5:00 pm. on Wednesday, November 2, 2016.
4. The use of native plants protected by New York State is prohibited, as is the use of any fern (or fern parts) native to New York.
5. Judging will be from 10:00 am. to 12:00 pm. Decisions of the judges are final.
6. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
7. Neither Seventh District nor Burgundy Basin is responsible for damage, loss or injury. Please label all personal property.
8. No artificial plant material is permitted in the show.
9. All rules of the current 2007 edition of National Garden Clubs, Inc.'s *Handbook for Flower Shows* will apply for all divisions.

## NGC Top Exhibitor Achievement Awards:

### DIVISION I, HORTICULTURE

#### AWARD OF HORTICULTURAL EXCELLENCE / GREEN, ORANGE & BLUE ROSETTE

Awarded to the highest scoring exhibit of 95 or above in the entire Division.

#### AWARD OF MERIT ORANGE ROSETTE

May be offered and awarded to Sections having a common horticultural characteristic.

Five may be awarded to a named Blue Ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in each designated section. Sections A,B,C,D and E are eligible.

#### GROWER'S CHOICE AWARD HUNTER GREEN ROSETTE

May be offered and awarded to the highest scoring exhibit. Section G is eligible.

#### ARBOREAL AWARD BICOLOR GREEN ROSETTE

May be offered and awarded to a Section of tree and shrub branches scoring 95 or above. Sections H and I are eligible.

### DIVISION II, DESIGN

#### HOLIDAY EXCELLENCE AWARD RED ROSETTE

Awarded to the highest scoring exhibit of 95 or above in the entire Division.

#### TABLE ARTISTRY AWARD BURGUNDY ROSETTE

Two awards (one per section) may be offered and awarded to the highest scoring exhibit. Sections A and B are eligible.

#### PETITE AWARD SMALL ROSETTE OF BLUE AND WHITE RIBBONS

May be offered and awarded to the highest scoring exhibit. Section D is eligible.

#### CLUB COMPETITION AWARD LIGHT BLUE ROSETTE

May be offered and awarded to the highest scoring exhibit. Section C is eligible.

#### DESIGNER'S CHOICE AWARD PURPLE ROSETTE

May be offered and awarded to the highest scoring exhibit. Section E is eligible.

#### AGNES SHADDOCK AWARD ROTATING SILVER CUP

May be awarded to the highest scoring design by a Seventh District Judges Council Member. Section F is eligible.

Section G. COMBINATION PLANTINGS

Advanced Reservations required

Class 23. Dish garden – (max. 10 " diameter container)

A miniature landscape in an open container. One or more accessories may be added, which must be in scale with plants and each other.

Class 24. Desertarium (max. 10" diameter container)

A miniature landscape of cacti and/or succulents. One or more accessories, in proper scale with the plant material and with each other, may be included.

Class 25. Trough (max. 15" diameter container)

A miniature landscape arranged in a container such as English stone or hypertufa that will withstand weather greater than dish gardens. Container may appear dominant in size.

One branch not to exceed 30" from cut end to tip, and containing more than one node.

## DIVISION II, DESIGN RULES

1. All General Show Rules apply.
2. All designs must be the work of one individual except for Section C, class 7. Some plant material must be used in each entry, but need not be grown by the exhibitor.
3. Advance reservations for all Design Classes must be made by October 19, 2016 to: Toni Howe, (585) 265-1081. Designers are encouraged to include a 3x5 card listing plant material.
4. Fresh and/or dried plant material may be used in all design classes. No artificial or treated plant material is permitted. A designer may enter more than one class. It is the responsibility of the designer to find a substitute if not able to fulfill a class and notify the entry chairman.
5. A designer may enter more than one class. It is the responsibility of the designer to find a substitute if not able to fulfill a class and notify the entry chairman.

#### SECTION A: "Seasonal Times"

Eligible for Table Artistry Award

##### Class 1. "Room Service"

4 entries

A tray for one staged on a 30 inch high black covered and skirted table with a neutral background in a space 24 inches wide by 30 inches deep, A decorative unit and all appointments must be placed on the tray, Judged for stability and scale, HB pg. 218

##### Class 2. "Kwanzaa"

4 entries

An Exhibition Table Type I using a background panel 24 inches wide by 36 inches high staged on a 30 Inch high black covered and skirted table in a space 30 inches wide by 30 inches deep. Must include a decorative unit. HB pg. 216

##### Class 3. "Hanukkah"

4 entries

An Exhibition Table Type II using a background panel 24 inches wide by 36 inches high staged on a 30 inch high black covered and skirted table in a space 30 inches wide by 30 inches deep. Type II does not contain a decorative unit, but must include some plant material to carry out design. HB pgs. 216-217



## SECTION B. "Special Settings"

Eligible for Table Artistry Award

### Class 4. "Fireside"

4 entries

A functional table for 2, staged on designer's card table, set for actual service of food. No flatware. HB pgs. 215-216

### Class 5. "Tapas Time"

4 entries

A bistro table 40 inches tall covered with a black cloth, set for appetizers with friend or two using a creative design 15 inches or higher. HB pg. 217

### Class 6. "Winter Outing"

4 entries

An Alfresco Design using a basket. Staged in a quarter of a 60 inch round black covered and skirted table. (Staging will include a faux campfire in the middle of the table.) HB pg. 218

## SECTION C. "Auld Lang Syne"

Eligible for Club Competition Award

### Class 7. "Ring In The New Year"

4 entries

A buffet table for 4 or more staged on a 96 inch long by 30 inch wide beige covered table. An 8 inch overhang of tablecloth is required. Judged for ease of service and un-crowded appointments. HB pg. 218

## SECTION D. "Brief Encounters" with...

Eligible for Petite Award

### Class 8. "Sugar Plum Fairy"

4 entries

A Type II miniature hanging design not exceeding 5 inches in any direction to be hung at eye level from a device provided by the committee in a space 8 inches by 8 inches against a beige wall. HB pg. 202

### Class 9. "Santa Claus"

4 entries

A small creative design staged on a black covered raised table in a space 10 inches by 10 inches using a background and underlay. Design not to exceed 8 inches in any direction. HB pg. 208

### Class 10. "Scrooge"

4 entries

A creative miniature design staged at eye level on a black covered table in a space 8 inches by 8 inches using a background and underlay. Design not to exceed 5 inches in any direction. HB pgs. 203-204

## SECTION E. "Holiday Moments"

Eligible for Designer's Choice Award

### Class 11. "First Frost"

4 entries

A reflective design staged on a black square pedestal 40 inches high with a 24 inches by 18 inches top. Reflective material should be an integral part of overall design. Designer's choice of plant material and other components. HB pg. 207

### Class 12. "Giving Thanks"

4 entries

A Parallel Design staged on a black covered table in a space 24 inches wide by 30 inches deep using a background panel 24 inches wide by 36 inches high. Only the overall effect must appear parallel as components in each grouping need not be equidistant or of the same plant materials. Designer's choice of plant material and other components. HB pg. 206

### Class 13. "Celebration"

4 entries

A Traditional Mass design staged on a black skirted table in a space 24 inches wide by 30 inches deep using a background panel 24 inches wide by 36 inches high and an underlay. Designer's choice of plant material and other components. HB pgs. 182-183

## SECTION F. "Grand Gala"

Eligible for the Agnes Shaddock Award  
Judges and Student Judges Class

### Class 14. "Luminosity"

4 entries

A Creative Design incorporating lights staged on a 1 foot high platform in a space 30 inches by 30 inches on white square cubes (2 are 24 inches square and 2 are 25 inches square). Subtle lighting must be an integral part of the design and its effect readily apparent. Outlets for power available. HB pgs. 202-203

### EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS

#### SECTION A. "Gifts of Knowledge"

- Eligible for Educational Award
- Exhibit 1. "Gifts for Wildlife: Substitutes for Invasive Plants" 1 entry  
To instruct and inform about common plants that are too successful in the environment and the importance of making environmentally wise decisions in selecting plant material. Alternate choices are suggested, with some that provide food for wildlife. Exhibit must use a minimum of 18 square feet. To be staged on a table 6 feet by 30 inches and 30 inches from the floor. Table draped in black provided by the committee.
- Exhibit 2. "Gifts from Friends" 1 entry  
To teach how to prolong the life of Poinsettias and other blooming gifts, as well as techniques for helping Amaryllis, African violets and others to flower again. Exhibit must use a minimum of 18 square feet. To be staged on a table 6 inches by 30 inches and 30 inches from the floor. Table draped in black provided by the committee.

## ARTISTIC CRAFTS

### SECTION B. "Creative Gifts"

Eligible for the Artistic Crafts Award  
Advanced Reservations required  
4 entries

#### Class 1. "Gifts for Friends"

Brooch made entirely of dried plant material (except clasp).  
Plant surfaces may be embellished. Holiday to be stated. To be  
displayed on a black velvet square six inches by six inches.

#### Class 2. "Gifts for the Tree"

4 entries

Ornament decorated with dried plant material. Plant surfaces  
may be embellished. Non-plant material may be added, but  
plant material must dominate. Ornament no greater than 3  
inches in any dimension. To be hung from a two-dimensional  
tree near eye level.

#### Class 3. "Gifts for the Birds"

4 entries

A feast of bird food suitable for hanging from a tree. Not a  
conventional bird feeder. No greater than 8 inches in any  
dimension. To be hung from a rod near eye level.
